If no students show up, use the time to answer questions or pose practice questions to students via the discussion board.
- Find a replacement for your peer mentor hour if you cannot make it (cancellation is a last resort).
- Reflect on the semester and what you learned through a final one-page paper with specifications the instructor will provide.
